Our Holy Prophet ﷺ says:

استبشروا بالخير تجدوه

“Hope for good, you will find good.” Hope for goodness and you will find it. There is goodness behind everything. Everything you do should be looked at with goodness. If you hope for goodness, Allah ﷻ will turn even the badness into goodness through His will. But if you look at everything in a bad way, it will be bad as well.

Therefore, it is necessary to constantly think about goodness in every work; in every work, whether it is or it is not [good]. When that happens, a person will be comfortable and at peace. “This is Allah’s ﷻ will. Allah ﷻ has certainly willed us good. This job will turn out good. What we do will be good. Where we go is good. Where we come from is good. There is goodness in everything.” And so people will find goodness.

Our Holy Prophet ﷺ is ‘أَصْدَقُ الصَّادِقِينَ’, ‘The most truthful among the truthful’. Everything he says is the truth. We should say: ‘أَمَنَّا وَصَدَقْنَا’, ‘We believe and we confirm’, and do what he says. Subhan’Allah, Allah Azza wa Jalla sent our Holy Prophet ﷺ as a mercy to people. If people want to live comfortably in this world and in the hereafter, they must follow our Holy Prophet’s ﷺ way and do what he ﷺ showed.
